Genesis 6:4 There were giants (Nephilim – lies) in the earth in those days; and also after that, when the sons of God came in unto the daughters of men, and they bare *children* to them, the same *became* mighty men which *were* of old, men of renown.

- 5 And GOD saw that the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that every imagination of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually...
- 8 But Noah found grace in the eyes of the LORD.

But Noah

אפי Noah (rest) vav – man, nun – seed of life, chet – inner room

The flood of lies (giants) are overcome by planting the seeds of life within your inner room. Doesn't this sound like the parable of parables and the reign of the Kingdom within man??



Romans 9:9 For this *is* the word of promise, At this time will I come, and Sara shall have a son. **IO** And not only *this*; but when Rebecca also had conceived by one, even by our father Isaac; **II** (For *the children* being not yet born, neither having done any good or evil, that the purpose of God according to election might stand, not of works, but of him that calleth;) **I2** It was said unto her, The elder shall serve the younger. **I3** As it is written, Jacob have I loved, but Esau have I hated.

God is only love. If we took scripture as inerrant versus allegory, we would have to say God was not loving to Hagar and Ishmael, and "hated" Esau while still in the womb. We would say that instead of the same yesterday, today and forever, He was different before the cross. We would have to say He drowned most of humanity and seemingly innocent animals.

All the destruction, "anger" and "hatred" is for anything that would keep you from perfect love and the beautiful inheritance He has provided as a loving Father. Let His consuming fire of love burn up everything that says God is not love and consume all guilt, shame, fear and feelings of unworthiness.

Revelation 20:10 And the devil that deceived them was cast into the lake of fire and brimstone, where the beast and the false prophet *are*, and shall be tormented day and night for ever and ever. .. **14** And death and hell were cast into the lake of fire. This is the second death. **15** And whosoever was not found written in the book of life was cast into the lake of fire.

Fire **4442** pýr – fire. In Scripture, fire is often used figuratively – like with the "fire of God" which transforms all it touches into light and likeness with itself

Brimstone **2303** theion - equivalent to divine incense, because burning brimstone was regarded as having power to purify, and to ward off contagion

Torment **928** basanizo **from 931** básanos – originally, a black, silicon-based stone used as "a touchstone" to test the purity of precious metals (like silver and gold).



You are a perfectly loved son/daughter. Don't let reason or whether you are deserving or not rob you from your inheritance and what the Father has freely provided. The spiritual or younger son has dominion over the older physical.

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Faith comes naturally when you understand the Father's love. You have faith when you realize any picture you create and emotionalize gets planted in your subconscious or heart. And The Father sees what you do within and brings it to pass like the miraculous power of a seed planted in the earth.
